SAR's, "Bird Flu", TB, and the threat of Bio-terrorism have all driven hospitals to plan for the potential impact. Nosocomial infections are of increasing concern to today's risk managers. While media coverage has tended to mainly focus on Stachybotrys, Aspergillus and Legionella, other potentially harmful fungi have been underreported. Mr. Streifel is a nationally recognized hospital environmental expert. Currently with the University of Minnesota Hospital Department of Environmental Health and Safety, he has 30 years direct experience managing the complexities of the hospital environment. Mr. Streifel has assisted well over 200 hospitals worldwide in problem solving air quality issues and establishing safe patient care environments for solid organ and bone marrow transplant services. He has provided leadership to the healthcare community in the management of construction disruption, water damage, mold and fungal contamination and the subsequent disease causing situations associated with these exposures. Mr. Streifel continues to work closely with industry leaders and organizations such as the American Institute of Architects and the American Society of Hospital Engineers in the design and management of special ventilation systems for the patient care environment.

Mr. Streifel has lectured and published extensively on the indoor air environment focusing on recognition, planning and mitigation of indoor hazards particularly microbial contamination. His experience has been of value for assisting in the design of critical care environments and buildings requiring consideration for indoor air management.

General Directions

From East

Take SR 520 to I-405 South. Exit at SE 8th Street (Exit 12). Turn right off the exit, and then turn right onto 112th Avenue NE. Continue for 5 blocks, through the intersection at Main Street, and then turn right into the first driveway.

From North

Take I-405 South to Exit 12 (SE 8th Street) and turn right at the light. Proceed 3 blocks and turn right onto 112th Avenue SE. Continue for 5 blocks, through the intersection at Main Street, and then turn right into the first driveway.

From West
